

## Generalization of quality education through Massive Open Online Courses

The ASEM Network of MOOC Initiative was suggested in 2016 for ASEM partners to share information on MOOC systems and to make collaborative improvements to these systems. Since the first stakeholders' forum in 2017, the initiative has worked under the four projects of stakeholders' forums, best practice surveys, joint development of content, and QA guidelines. At the ASEM Education Ministers' Meeting (ASSEM6), the development of the MOOC network was given high importance for more open, flexible, accessible, and accountable education in ASEM.

Learning from other partners' MOOC systems




Developing guidelines and cooperating in content creation

# under the ASEM Network of MOOCs Initiative



## 1 The ASEM MOOC Stakeholders' Forum

The "Stakeholders' Forum" is a dialogue-oriented project for sharing information and establishing networks among educational representatives, experts, and officials among ASEM partners.

During the forum, speakers give presentations on case studies, MOOC implementation experi-

ences, and the current state of MOOC platforms in each country. Those involved in attending the forum can improve their own MOOC platforms by learning from other MOOC cases.

Also, people with relevant roles in MOOC systems can form networks during the forum. These networks among principals, educational experts, and officials working for MOOC platforms serve as a facilitator for co-development and sharing of online content. Such efforts help MOOC platforms offer citizens more diverse content.

## 2 Joint Development of ASEM MOOC Content
